Member Rules and Code of Conduct

Updated December 1, 2023

The Saginaw Country Club is the Great Lakes Bay Region's premiere private country club. For more than 125 years, the Saginaw Country Club has provided its members and guests with the very best in championship golf, pool-side fun, casual and elegant dining, and social events.

To create this member experience, the Club is reliant on the membership to follow the rules and code of conduct set out by the Board of Governors.

In accordance with the Bylaws of Saginaw Country Club, Inc., the Board of Governors has adopted the following rules and code of conduct that all members are expected to follow at all times. In addition, the Board of Governors has established dues, fees, and assessments that are available by contacting the Club Office.

SECTION 1 GENERAL RULES

- 1.1 The Club assumes no responsibility for loss or damage of personal property of any member or guest.
- 1.2 Club employees are not permitted to do personal work or leave the Club premises on personal errands for members, during their regular working hours.
- 1.3 Members may not reprimand any employee of the Club. In case of discourtesy or lack of service, complaints should be made to the Club Manager or to the appropriate Board Chairperson in writing. Individuals violating this rule shall be subject to the actions of the Board of Governors.
- 1.4 Club property shall not be removed from the Club's premises, except for Club catered events.
- 1.5 Members are required to park their automobiles in the designated parking spaces. No parking will be permitted in fire lanes, no parking areas, and unloading zones. Speeds of 10 mph on the Club grounds shall be observed.
- 1.6 Posting of notices on the Club premises must first be submitted to the Club Manager, who will forward this request for approval to the officers of the club.
- 1.7 Members' children may not be employed by the Club in any capacity.
- 1.8 The Club Manager is fulfilling one of the duties of his/her position, when calling any violation of Club rules or misconduct to the attention of members or guests. Continued violation of any Club rules of etiquette and courtesy must be reported by the Club Manager to the appropriate committee and to the Board of Governors.

SECTION 2 DRESS CODE

2.1 CLUBHOUSE DRESS CODE

- 2.1.1 While dining or utilizing the clubhouse, the dress code is Business Casual at all times unless otherwise specified for a special event.
- 2.1.2 Gentlemen should not wear hats when seated for dining in the main clubhouse level. Hats may be worn when dining in Bar Eighteen98 and on the Patio.
- 2.1.3 Denim jeans (without tears or holes) and dress shorts are acceptable in all dining areas.
- 2.1.4 Athletic wear, cut-offs, tank tops, halter tops, swimwear and t-shirts, are not deemed to be appropriate attire in the clubhouse. If members are using the Fitness Center in this attire, they must change before utilizing a dining room.

2.2 GOLF COURSE DRESS CODE

- 2.2.1 Adults and children must wear proper golf attire, including footwear when using the golf course and practice facilities. All shirts must be made of an opaque material.
- 2.2.2 Gentlemen must wear dress shorts or slacks as well as a collared shirt.
- 2.2.3 Ladies must wear dress shorts, slacks or a skirt as well as a collared shirt. Ladies may also wear sleeveless or collarless golf shirts that have appropriate necklines.
- 2.2.4 Denim jeans are not allowed on the golf course June 1st through August 31st.
- 2.2.5 At no time should athletic wear, short shorts, halter-tops, swim attire or clothing with holes/tears be worn on the golf course or practice facilities.
- 2.2.6 Closed-toe shoes must be worn at all times. Metal spikes are not permitted.
- 2.2.7 Improperly dressed golfers will be required to change before golfing.

2.3 POOL DRESS CODE

- 2.3.1 Bathers shall have suits that are designed as bathing suits. Improperly dressed bathers will be asked to change before swimming.
- 2.3.2 Cut-offs and shorts are not acceptable swim attire.
- 2.3.3 Bathers should wear tops when going to or from the pool area.

2.4 TENNIS DRESS CODE

- 2.4.1 Proper tennis attire must be worn by adults and children on the courts. Bathing suits or cut-offs are not proper tennis attire.
- 2.4.2 Gentlemen are required to wear sleeved shirts of an opaque material.
- 2.4.3 Only shoes designed for tennis play will be allowed.
- 2.4.4 Improperly dressed tennis players will be asked to change before playing.

SECTION 3 CLUBHOUSE FACILITIES

3.3 CLUBHOUSE AND DINING HOURS

- 3.3.1 Hours of Operation will be communicated by email or other methods to all members. This includes planned closures for club parties and private functions.
- 3.3.2 The Clubhouse will be closed on Mondays.
- 3.3.3 The clubhouse will close no later than the time prescribed by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission.
- 3.3.4 All areas of the Club will be available to members for private parties on application to the Club Manager; subject to availability of facilities, and established procedures and policies.

3.4 TIPPING

- 3.4.1 All food and beverage purchases include a service charge that is part of overall employee compensation and is shared between servers and kitchen staff. Members, at their discretion, may give additional gratuity that goes directly to their server.
- 3.4.2 Gratuity for all other club services is at the Members' discretion.

3.5 RESERVATIONS

- 3.5.1 To ensure the maximum enjoyment of facilities and to provide efficient service and sufficient menu items, your advance reservations will be most appreciated.
- 3.5.2 Reservation for Club parties, including special member parties, may be cancelled without charge twenty-four (24) hours prior to the affair. Full pre-arranged costs will be charged if members or guests do not cancel the reservation.
- 3.5.3 Seating arrangements will be made by the Club Manager, or Dining Room Manager, in order reservations are received and according to limitations of space.

3.6 LOCKER ROOMS

- 3.6.1 Golf bags, clubs and pull carts shall not be stored in the locker rooms, on top of lockers or inside of lockers. Said items found in these areas will be moved to the pro shop for proper storage under the supervision of the golf professional.
- 3.6.2 Rental charges for lockers and locker room services are established by the Board of Governors. Guests of members are furnished lockers (if available) and locker room service.

3.7 FITNESS CENTER RULES

- 3.7.1 Prior to initially using the fitness center, members must fill out the waiver electronically or at the club office.
- 3.7.2 All members must sign in when using the Fitness Center.
- 3.7.3 Members' children under 16 may not use the Fitness Center without adult supervision.
- 3.7.4 Members should not use the Fitness Center if they have any health conditions.
- 3.7.5 Members should not drop heavy weights or be rough on equipment.
- 3.7.6 Music must be on earbuds or headphones at all times.
- 3.7.7 Shirts and shoes must be worn at all times.

3.8 BRIDGE CLUB RULES

- 3.8.1 All Saginaw Country Club Men and Women Members are entitled to play Bridge or cards daily.
- 3.8.2 The Saginaw Country Club Bridge Association will be responsible for electing a chairperson to administer the required responsibilities.
- 3.8.3 Men and Women who have the privileges at other reciprocal Clubs are invited to play. They must charge their lunches to their reciprocal Club. Reciprocal members from the Saginaw Club shall pay a \$3 fee every time they play Bridge at the Saginaw Country Club.
- 3.8.4 Guests are allowed to play five (5) times in a calendar year. There will be an \$8 guest fee per visit. They are required to purchase lunch on the day they are playing. If the guest does not belong to a reciprocal club, the guest fee may be paid by the member or the guest. All members of the Saginaw Country Club are responsible for their guests and responsible for instructing the wait staff who is paying the guest fee.
- 3.8.5 Each Bridge table must include at least one Saginaw Country Club member. The Saginaw Country Club member will be responsible for filling out the attendance slip for the table. If there is no member present, the table will be asked to leave if a Saginaw Country Club member is not willing to join the table.
- 3.8.6 All players must respect the SCC dress code at all times.

SECTION 4 GUESTS AND SIGNIFICANT OTHERS

4.1 GUESTS – GENERAL RULES

- 4.1.1 Use of the Club facilities shall be limited to members and their guests. Use of the dining facilities by members and their guests is encouraged at all times, except for those occasions which are reserved exclusively for members. There are no restrictions on the number of guests a member may invite to enjoy the dining facilities.
- 4.1.2 Members are required to register their guests at the pro shop for golf, at the swimming pool for swimming, and at the tennis courts for tennis. It shall be the duty of the member to accompany or play with such member's guest. Guests are limited to five (5) visits per year to each club facility. Any exceptions must first get Board approval.
- 4.1.3 Childcare providers of members are not considered guests while they are providing those services at the swimming pool and dining facilities.
- 4.1.4 Members will be held responsible for any damages to, or removal of, Club property by guests or any other person for whom the member is accountable.
- 4.1.5 Members are responsible for debts incurred by their guests.
- 4.1.6 No cash will be received, except at such places as maybe approved by the Board of Governors.
- 4.1.7 Former members of the Club who left in good standing are welcome to return as guests and will be subject to the same five (5) visit per year limitation applicable to all guests. To ensure fairness to current members, former members will not be eligible to participate as guests in Club tournaments or competitive events for a period of two (2) years following the end of their membership.
- 4.1.8 Individuals whose prior membership concluded with outstanding financial obligations to the Club or as a result of disciplinary action will not be eligible to return as guests.

4.2 USE OF THE GOLF COURSE BY GUESTS

- 4.2.1 All guests will be limited to five (5) rounds of play during the calendar year, with the exception of the Invitational, Guest Days and outside golf events. Any exceptions to this rule must get Board approval.
- 4.2.2 Each guest must register at the Pro Shop.
- 4.2.3 Except by special arrangement made in advance through the Golf Professional, a member must play with his or her guest(s).
- 4.2.4 A Class B member is entitled to play golf not more than (3) times during a calendar year and is required to pay published green fees and cart fees, if a cart is desired. Dining-only members are not eligible for this benefit. The (3) rounds can be played by the member, spouse, or children but shall not exceed (3) rounds per membership. Class B members are not permitted to have guests on the golf course and rounds played by Class B members' children should adhere to the Golf Rules Applicable to Members' Children.
- 4.2.5 Class B members are not permitted to use the golf practice facilities except while utilizing one of their (3) paid golf rounds during the year.

4.3 RECIPROCITY

- 4.3.1 Only charge privileges will be allowed to members of GAM (Golf Association of Michigan) USGA (United States Golf Association) and other clubs with established reciprocal agreements, as approved by the Board of Governors. In addition to the guest's signature, the name and address of the club must be printed on the chit. Reciprocal clubs are defined as those approved full-service clubs that are GAM members, and any other such clubs that allow Saginaw Country Club members like use of their facilities. A member of a reciprocal club is entitled to charge privileges at the Saginaw Country Club.

4.4 SIGNIFICANT OTHER DESIGNATION

- 4.4.1 The Country Club allows single members to name a "significant other." This option is available to Class A and B membership classifications EXCEPT those specifically designated as "SINGLE". A member can designate only one significant other at a time and a member must provide written notice of any change of significant other designee to the Club Manager. Applicable to both Class A and Class B memberships, the Board may restrict the significant other privileges if evidence of rule abuse is identified.
- 4.4.2 With regard to Class A members, the significant other may play golf without the member being present. There is no greens fee charge to the member for the significant other playing golf, but all other normal fees and charges will apply. The significant other has use of all the facilities and the privileges of the use of the club extend to children of the significant other. The significant other and children of the significant other may charge on the account of the member unless the member provides written notice to the Club Manager.
- 4.4.3 Class B members may have a significant other. The significant other has all use of the facility generally available to the Class B member. The privilege of the use of the Club extends to children of the significant other and the significant other and children of the significant other may charge on the account of the member unless the member provides written notice to the Club Manager.

SECTION 5 RULES APPLICABLE FOR MEMBER'S CHILDREN

5.1 GENERAL RULES

- 5.1.1 All children under eight (8) years of age must remain accompanied by an adult during their entire stay at the Club and will not be permitted to roam about the clubhouse and grounds.
- 5.1.2 Children are not allowed to run around or play on the golf course or practice areas at any time except as provided in Section 5.2.
- 5.1.3 Children under sixteen (16) years of age, are not permitted to use dining facilities at any time, unless accompanied by an adult. Children between the ages of 8-16 may utilize the children's side of the Hogan Grill without accompaniment provided that they conduct themselves in an appropriate way.
- 5.1.4 Alcoholic beverages will not be served, nor consumed, by persons under twenty-one (21) years of age, nor are such persons permitted to order any alcoholic beverage from the service personnel.
- 5.1.5 Persons under eighteen (18) years of age will not be permitted to play cards at the Club.
- 5.1.6 Children are not allowed on the bridge with roller blades or skateboards. Bikes must be walked up and down the bridge. Children may ride their bike on the grounds for the purpose of properly parking the bike at a club facility. No "joyriding" is permitted.
- 5.1.7 The Club Manager shall have the authority to deny the privileges of the Club to any minor for unbecoming conduct.

5.2 GOLF RULES APPLICABLE TO MEMBERS' CHILDREN

- 5.2.1 Only Class A members' children are eligible to use the golf course and practice facilities and any guest of a members' child shall pay full guest fees.
- 5.2.2 Children under sixteen (16) years of age, are not permitted to use the golf course and practice facilities unless they have permission from the Golf Professional or they are accompanied by an adult.
- 5.2.3 All children using the golf course, including the putting greens and the practice range, must comply with the rules regarding attire.
- 5.2.4 All children must have a valid driver's license to drive a golf cart.
- 5.2.5 Children, even though accompanied by an adult, are to give way to faster playing adult members.
- 5.2.6 Regardless of the age of a member's child, the child must demonstrate a knowledge of golf etiquette and the rules of golf. The child must also demonstrate play competency, so as to prevent damage to the course and to avoid unduly slow play.

SECTION 6 SWIMMING POOL

6.1 GENERAL INFORMATION

- 6.1.1 The sanitation and safety rules of the State of Michigan will be strictly enforced. The Club Manager, Pool Director and Lifeguards are responsible for the enforcement of rules and for maintaining all sanitary and safety precautions. **The Club Manager, Pool Director, and/or the Lifeguards can establish and enforce such rules as, in their opinion, safety may require.**
- 6.1.2 The Saginaw Country Club, the Pool/Tennis/Fitness Committee and the Lifeguards assume no responsibility for the safety of anyone using the pool or the theft and damage of personal property.
- 6.1.3 The swimming pool will open for the season on Memorial Day weekend and will remain open through Labor Day weekend. Pool hours and schedules will be communicated to members through email or other communication methods.
- 6.1.4 Swimming lessons and a competitive swim team will be offered to members. Details and fees will be communicated through email or other communication method.
- 6.1.5 There will not be open swim during swim team practice/meets or swim lessons.
- 6.1.6 Only qualified members, their families and registered guests are entitled to use the pool during designated hours. Guests must be accompanied by a member, who will be required to sign a chit for the guest fee. All members and guests must register on a master sign-in sheet at the Pool Office and include member's number. Members are requested to acquaint their guests with pool regulations. **Pool guests are limited to 5 visits per year.**
- 6.1.7 Use of the pool by adult members is encouraged. If a member would like to swim laps during open swim, arrangements for a lane line can be made available.
- 6.1.8 Persons in swimming attire are not permitted in the clubhouse, other than in locker rooms.
- 6.1.9 Private Parties and Fees: Upon application by a member, the pool may be used for special parties provided arrangements are made with the Club Manager. A Lifeguard must be on duty at all times when the pool is being used. An additional charge for guards will apply.

6.2 SWIMMING POOL RULES

- 6.2.1 No one is permitted to use the pool unless a Lifeguard is present.
- 6.2.2 Swimmers must shower before entering pool.
- 6.2.3 Persons with colds, skin eruptions, inflamed eyes or similar infections will be refused admittance.
- 6.2.4 Spitting, chewing gum, spouting water, blowing nose, or otherwise polluting the water is prohibited.
- 6.2.5 Smoking in the pool concourse is not allowed.
- 6.2.6 Club towels are not to be taken from the locker room for pool use.
- 6.2.7 Food or drinks purchased at the Club are allowed in the pool area. No outside food or beverage is allowed. No glass is allowed in the pool area. Everyone using the pool facilities is required to put one's own refuse into the receptacles provided for this purpose.
- 6.2.8 Running around concourse, pushing, tag games and dunking are strictly prohibited.
- 6.2.9 Lifeguards, at their discretion, may limit the quantity or type of inflatable devices and toys.
- 6.2.10 Adults will always have preference for the use of furniture in the pool area.
- 6.2.11 Members or guests may not reserve lounges or chairs, except while they are swimming. Towels or equipment left on chairs or lounges may be removed after a reasonable length of time.

6.3 DIVING BOARD RULES

- 6.3.1 To use the diving board, a swimmer must qualify by swimming the length of the pool and demonstrate the ability to float and tread water satisfactorily.
- 6.3.2 Only one (1) person allowed on the board at a time.
- 6.3.3 Be sure area below board is clear before diving.
- 6.3.4 Excessive bouncing on the board is not permitted.

6.4 WADING POOL RULES

- 6.4.1 Use of the wading pool shall be limited to children under five (5) years of age.
- 6.4.2 There is no lifeguard on duty therefore a parent or responsible adult of the child using the wading pool must be present at all times.
- 6.4.3 All children who use the wading pool must be out of diapers and potty-trained, or have a swim diaper on at all times. Parents are requested to use good judgement in taking children into the wading pool.
- 6.4.4 Playpens will not be permitted at poolside.

SECTION 7 TENNIS

7.1 TENNIS RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 7.1.1 The U.S. Tennis Association Rules shall apply to all play, except where modified by the Pool/Tennis/Fitness Committee.
- 7.1.2 No person shall distract or interfere with the players while a match is in progress.
- 7.1.3 Loud and boisterous conduct or profanity will not be tolerated, and at the discretion of the Club Manager, Tennis Professional and/or instructors, offenders may be required to leave the courts.
- 7.1.4 Non-playing children will not be permitted in the court enclosure at any time.
- 7.1.5 Tennis instruction is currently operated by the Saginaw Athletic Club. Hours, rates and other information will be shared and is available upon request.
- 7.1.6 All court usage for open play is on a first-come, first-served basis. Any open play during tennis instruction must be first approved by the Tennis Professional
- 7.1.7 Members playing open tennis must register at the courts and indicate their time of arrival, membership number and name of any guests. Members will be assessed the appropriate guest fee, as listed under the Dues, Fees and Assessments Section. **Tennis guests are limited to 5 visits per year.**

SECTION 8 GOLF COURSE

8.1 GOLF COURSE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 8.1.1 The rules of the United States Golf Association shall govern all play, except as modified by local rules.
- 8.1.2 All players are required to replace divots, to rake sand traps and to repair ball marks on the greens. The hitting of practice balls from the fairways, from the sand traps or to the greens is expressly prohibited.
- 8.1.3 Members and guests are to observe the rights of adjoining property owners.
- 8.1.4 Four-ball matches shall have the right-of-way over all other matches on weekends, Thursdays, and holidays. Foursomes are urged at all times, if available.
- 8.1.5 No groups larger than a foursome allowed without permission from the Golf Professional.
- 8.1.6 Only dues paying members, their spouses, and significant others that are in good standing, are eligible to play in Club Tournaments.
- 8.1.7 Any non-scheduled group play must have prior Board of Governors approval.
- 8.1.8 No one using the driving range shall hit a ball over the fence. A member is responsible for his/her guests and family members with regard to violations of the rule.
 - 8.1.8.1 1st Violation: Loss of range privileges for one week
 - 8.1.8.2 2nd Violation: Loss of range privileges for one month
 - 8.1.8.3 3rd Violation: Loss of golf privileges for the remainder of season
 - 8.1.8.4 4th Violation: May result in expulsion from the Saginaw Country Club.
- 8.1.9 When the warning system for lightning goes off (solid tone), all players shall immediately seek cover. Please note this is NOT AN OPTION and all people playing golf shall immediately stop playing golf until the lightning has CLEARED (intermittent tone).

8.2 GOLF ETIQUETTE

- 8.2.1 The rules of golf and golf etiquette should be well known and observed by every golfer. The code for correct behavior is a pleasant one, easily understood and designed for the all-around enjoyment of the game.
- 8.2.2 Members are expected to play with integrity and post all scores for handicap purposes. The Golf Professional can assist with incomplete scorecards, equitable stroke control or other questions.
- 8.2.3 Players should at all times play without undue delay. It is recommended that a round of golf shall not exceed 4 hours and 15 minutes.
- 8.2.4 Players, while looking for a lost ball, shall adhere to the three minute rule, should allow other matches coming to pass them; that they should signal to the players following them to pass; and that upon having given such a signal, they should not continue their play until the players have passed and are out of range.
- 8.2.5 No one should move, talk or stand close to, or directly behind, the ball or the hole when a player is making a stroke.
- 8.2.6 The player who has the honor should be allowed to tee off before his/her opponent tees off.
- 8.2.7 No player should play until the player(s) in front is out of range.
- 8.2.8 When the result of a hole has been determined, players should immediately leave the putting green and the area adjacent to the green.
- 8.2.9 A player should see that any divot cut or displaced by him/her is either replaced & pressed down or filled with divot mix and all ball marks on greens be repaired before putting out.
- 8.2.10 Players must carefully rake all sand traps after use.

8.2.11 Players should see that they-do not injure the holes by walking or standing close to them, or when removing or replacing the flag-stick.

8.2.12 All play shall begin on Hole #1 unless authorized by the Pro Shop.

8.3 PRO SHOP HOURS

8.3.1 Monday (Closed) – Bag Room Open at Noon

8.3.2 In Season (*Memorial Day Weekend to Labor Day Weekend*)

Tuesday through Friday	8:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m.
Saturday and Sunday	7:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m.

8.3.3 Out of Season (*Varies with Weather and Daylight*)

Tuesday through Sunday 9:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

8.4 HOURS OF PLAY

8.4.1 There shall be no authorized play, beginning on any hole other than number one (#1), except as designated by the Golf Professional.

8.4.2 Monday - The course shall be closed to all play until 12:00 noon, while open play is allowed thereafter.

8.4.3 Tuesday - Sunday, open play subject to scheduled events and League Play. Please check the Calendar of Golf Events and with the Golf Professional.

8.4.4 Tee times are required on weekends and Holidays during the season (*Memorial Day Weekend to Labor Day Weekend*). Call the Pro Shop to schedule a tee time.

8.4.5 The Pro Shop may allow you to play at earlier times, but the maintenance crew will have the right of way.

8.5 CLUB STORAGE / BAGROOM

8.5.1 Club storage is included for one individual with golf memberships. Additional club storage for other members of your family (including children) is available at an additional cost.

8.6 GOLF CARTS AND PULL CARTS

8.6.1 Golf Carts will be available on a first come, first served basis.

8.6.2 The Golf Course Superintendent, acting under the direction of the Green Committee, shall determine when golf carts may or may not be used on the course.

8.6.3 Golf carts at no time may be driven on or across tees, greens, aprons of greens, or within thirty (30) feet of the putting surface. Drivers should follow the route marked by golf cart signs, cart paths and ropes. Golf carts must not be parked in front of the green while putting out, move carts to the side closest to the next tee.

8.6.4 No golf carts should be driven on adjoining property owner's yards.

8.6.5 No more than two (2) persons are permitted in a golf cart at any one time.

8.6.6 Not more than two (2) bags are permitted on a golf cart.

8.6.7 Golf cart rates are determined by the Board of Governors.

SECTION 9 CLUB MEMBERSHIP AND STATUS

9.1 SPONSORING A NEW MEMBER

- 9.1.1 Candidates for membership in any classification shall be proposed by not less than two (2) members who shall submit a written recommendation. The Board of Governors shall act on such proposals in accordance with the Bylaws.
- 9.1.2 No person shall hold more than one (1) membership at any one time.

9.2 MEMBERSHIP CHANGES

- 9.2.1 Any Class A member shall be entitled to change his/her membership to any other classification, for which he/she is eligible, upon the sale or transfer of his/her stock in accordance with the Bylaws and upon election to such other classification in accordance with the Bylaws.
- 9.2.2 Any member transferring from Class "B" Membership to Class "A" Membership must pay the difference between the current dues and fees of the two classes including the difference in initiation fees.
- 9.2.3 Approved candidates for Class "A" Membership shall be entitled to purchase stock held by the Club in the following order of preference, provided the Board of Governors elects to transfer such stock: Junior → Other Class "B" Members → Others
- 9.2.4 Approved candidates for Class "B" Membership shall be elected in the following order of preference: Former "Class A" Members → Former "Class B" Members → Others

9.3 RESIGNATION

- 9.3.1 Members must give their intent to resign from the Club, in writing, no fewer than thirty (30) days prior to the member's desired resignation date.
- 9.3.2 Dues paid in advance are NOT refundable should a resignation be tendered after June 30th of each year. Should a resignation be tendered prior to June 30th, members are responsible for all charges and assessments and prorated dues using the monthly dues payment schedule.
- 9.3.3 If dues are paid on a 12-month schedule and a resignation is tendered before June 30th of each year, resigning members are responsible for all dues, assessments and charges through the month of resignation. Should the resignation occur after June 30th of each year, the member is responsible for all charges and assessments through the month of resignation and the full balance of the remaining year's dues.

9.4 REAPPLICATION TO THE CLUB

- 9.4.1 Applications from former members who have resigned in the past 12-months will not be considered.
 - 9.4.1.1 During this 12-month period, a former member can pay all of the monthly dues and fees since their resignation and be reinstated into the club without initiation fees provided that their membership was in good standing at the time of their resignation.
- 9.4.2 Applications from former members who have resigned in the past 10 years will not be eligible for any trial memberships or membership promotions and will be responsible for all initiation fees.

SECTION 10 MEMBERSHIP DUES AND FEES

10.1 DUES, INTITAION FEES AND FOOD/BEVERAGE MINIMUM

- 10.1.1 The Board of Governors sets initiation fees, annual dues and food/beverage minimums for each calendar year. Those fees are available by contacting the SCC Office.
- 10.1.2 Annual dues may be paid in full by January 31st to receive six (6) complimentary guest rounds of golf for golf members and three (3) complimentary guest rounds for recreational members. Nine holes or eighteen holes shall both be considered rounds of golf.
- 10.1.3 If dues are not paid in full by January 31st, they shall be paid in twelve (12) equal payments through December.
- 10.1.4 Newly elected members' dues will be pro-rated on a twelve (12) month basis.
- 10.1.5 Food and beverage minimum charges must be spent prior to November 30th of each calendar year. Should a member not equal or exceed the minimum charge, they will be billed for the difference.

10.2 FEES

- 10.2.1 Greens Fees are applicable for all guests and guests must play with a member. There are rates for nine holes and eighteen holes.
- 10.2.2 Cart Fees are applicable to members and guests and are billed per person. The current cart rates are available by contacting the Pro Shop.
- 10.2.3 When play is interrupted, the playing of five (5) holes shall be considered to constitute the playing of nine (9) holes. The playing of more than fourteen (14) holes shall be considered to constitute the playing of eighteen (18) holes for Green Fees and Cart fees.
- 10.2.4 Tennis Guest Fees are applicable for all guests and guests must play with a member. The current guest rates are available by contacting the SCC Office.
- 10.2.5 Pool Guest Fees are applicable for all guests and guests must be accompanied by a member. The current guest rates are available by contacting the SCC Office.:
- 10.2.6 Locker Room Fees and Locker Fees:
 - 10.2.6.1 Locker Room Fees are included in your monthly dues
 - 10.2.6.2 Lockers: Members are not required to have a locker. If members wish to have a locker to store personal items, those are billed per locker and the cost is available from the SCC Office.
- 10.2.7 Golf Bag Storage Fees (One bag storage is included in dues):
 - 10.2.7.1 Storage of one golf bag is included in all Class A member dues.
 - 10.2.7.2 Additional storage of golf bags for spouse, significant other, or children is available at an additional cost. Costs are available from the SCC Office.
- 10.2.8 Range fees are included with golf memberships.
